Our Organization

Since 1987, Smiles Foundation has been a Canadian Charitable Organization dedicated to improving the lives of vulnerable communities in the Dominican Republic.

We concentrate our efforts on providing essential services in areas such as dental care, active living, primary health education, and sustainable development.

In 2017 a Canadian program "Smiles in Action" has been added to our scope of work.

Through partnerships and community-driven initiatives, Smiles Foundation strives to empower individuals, creating long-lasting positive change, and fostering better opportunities for future generations.

In the Dominican Republic, we operate ten permanent dental clinics and various mobile units in high-needs areas, offering a wide range of preventative and restorative care. Through this work, we have directly impacted the lives of over 6.8 million people, providing free treatments to children and affordable services to families. In addition to dental care, we conduct vital health education, focusing on topics like nutrition, children's rights, and disease prevention, as well as several community-centered programs.

Our focus is on raising awareness and generating support for our programs. Through local events, partnerships, and educational outreach, we encourage everyone to actively participate in transforming lives. We aim to build stronger connections, fostering a sense of shared responsibility and global citizenship.


Canada

An increase of in-kind and monetary donations from **2023** to **2024**, reflects the growing generosity of **21.58%**.

In 2024, Smiles Foundation experienced enhanced engagement with valued supporters, including new donors and renewed contributions. Our events, campaigns, and outreach initiatives helped expand Smiles Foundation's donor base and boost the total amount donated.

Targeted campaigns have been particularly successful in 2024, encouraging more people to contribute both in monetary terms and through donations in-kind.



USA

From 2023 to 2024, the donations from our USA supporters saw a decrease of approximately **14.4%**

The economic conditions, such as inflation, changes in consumer spending and financial uncertainty, might have affected the ability or willingness of donors to contribute as much as in the previous year.

Most of the donations shipped from the USA were generously provided by **Henry Schein Cares**, our long-term valued partner.










Dominican Republic

- Comprehensive examinations and X-rays
- Prophylaxis
- Fluoride application
- Whitening
- Sealants
- Full range of restorative treatments
- Prosthetics (crowns, bridges, dentures)
- Endodontic and orthodontic procedures
- Implants
- Oral surgery.




Primary Healthcare Education

Health promotion and disease prevention are crucial to Smiles Foundation's efforts to improve health in the communities we serve.

It includes primary and oral health education, focusing on disease prevention and proper hygiene practices. Our dentists and health educators actively teach adequate brushing and flossing, encouraging patients to practice these skills on-site. Patients of all ages receive brochures and kits containing toothbrushes, floss, and toothpaste.

In addition to oral health, we offer lectures on topics such as environmental protection, domestic violence and bullying prevention, children's rights, STD transmission, as well as proper nutrition practices, addressing the specific needs of each community.




In Partnership with an **Anonymous Canadian Donor**

Dental Auxiliaries Program / 4 modules - 206 graduates

The aim of this program is to inspire and equip young individuals to pursue a careers in dental assisting with the long-term objective of helping them join our organization or secure similar employment opportunities. This initiative aligns with our mission and positively influences the lives of graduates by providing them with a chance to contribute to the community while gaining stable employment.















Food Distribution Program:

220 packages delivered to rural and low socioeconomic areas in the Dominican Republic.

April 20th, 2024, over 1,100 beneficiaries.

Approximately 2 kg of meat per family, with an average of 5 family members, were distributed in rural and low socioeconomic areas in the Dominican Republic.

June 26th, 2024, over 1,600 beneficiaries.

Visit to the Dominican Republic

In November 2024, the President and Founder of Smiles Foundation, Elina Katsman, visited the Dominican Republic clinics to ensure alignment with the Foundation's mission of providing accessible, high-quality healthcare to underserved communities.

Elina conducted the annual board meeting, as well as met with the volunteer group and local auditors to review and reinforce next year's goals and plans.

This visit allowed for direct engagement with staff, patients, and local partners, resulting in immediate improvements in resources, staffing, and facilities. By addressing key challenges and identifying areas for growth, it reinforced the Foundation's vision of sustainable, community-driven care, ensuring continued impact and future expansion.
